




Addis Ababa - Overview


Addis Ababa

- Capital city of Ethiopia, Seat of AU
- Area: 540 km² Population ≈ 3.7 million
- Rapid social and economical growth
- Massive changes in population
 - Rapid population growth of **3.9%** per annum (CSA)
 - Rapid urbanization (15% in 2005 to 25 % in 2025)
 - Rapid increases of motor vehicles



Addis Ababa - Overview

□ In grips of road safety crises \approx 4,009 fatalities over the past 10 years

Trained 102 Addis Ababa Traffic Police officers on Drink Driving and Seat belt Enforcement.









Creating Safer Streets and Mobility

■ WRI –EMBARQ has made safety inspection on Bole road corridor and 8 intersections.










Creating Safer Streets and Mobility

International Road Assessment Program (iRAP) has assessed 114km length of road corridors and star rated based on their crush risks.







Creating Safer Streets and Mobility

- NACTO has transformed Legare Intersection to improve safety and mobility
 - Temporary transformation using paints and planters
 - Priority is given to pedestrians
 - 2000 m² unused space reclaimed
 - Crossing distance reduced from 50m to 9.5m







Improving Data Collection and Monitoring


- Monitor outcomes of interventions
 - Fatalities, injuries, crashes
 - Risk factor behaviors (helmets, speed, drinking & driving, seat-belts)
- Strengthen surveillance systems






Improving Data Collection and Monitoring

- JHU carried out Baseline Survey on Risk Factors:
 - Alcohol (Drink Driving)
 - Speed (Speeding)
 - Motorcycle Helmet Use
 - Seatbelt & Child Restraint Use



- □ Aims to strategically stabilize, reduce, and eliminate road traumas from streets of Addis
 - Simple and achievable
 - Participatory
 - Adopted Safe System Principle
 - Inputs from International Experts BIGRS partners
- □ Serves for next 13 years (2017 2030)
 - Alignment with SDG 2030
- Approved by City Cabinet and Launched in March 2017





Developed to strategically tackle the prevailing road safety crises of the city.



VISION:


Envisioning Addis Ababa city free from road trauma by 2030

□ Safe System Approach


- Basis of the United Nations Decade of Action on Road Safety 2011-2020.

- Develop a road transport system which accommodates human error.








Modal Share

- □ 63% 2010 to 2015





Chart: Fatalities by vehicle type (2016)

DECADE OF ACTION FOR ROAD SAFETY 2011–2020



Targeted at Member States, the Global Plan aims to reduce the number of road traffic fatalities. It identifies five "pillars" or areas for intervention:

- 1 road safety management
- 2 safer roads and mobility
- 3 safer vehicles
- 4 safer road users
- 5 post-crash response



Addis Ababa Road Safety Strategy Implementation Plan

- Action items to be implemented by key members of the AA Road Safety Council
- Crucial to sustain ongoing efforts, knowledge transfer Capacitate Institutions
- Short term 3 years (2018-2020)
 - Current experience and capabilities of institutions
 - Draw lessons for Intermediate and Long term plans
- Aims to reduce fatalities and serious injuries by 30% by 2020
- Action Items
 - Alignment with the proposed road safety directions
 - Proposed with milestones, indicators, timelines, and responsibility matrices



- Safety Direction 1: Developing a road safety management system
 - 6 Action Items
 - Ensure the presence of an active Road Safety Council.
 - Guarantee the availability of funds for implementation of the Road Safety Strategy.
 - Establish a road safety forum in the city
 - Monitor and follow up on implementation of the action plan
 - Develop road safety knowledge and awareness in the city
 - Create necessary institutional and legal framework for road safety improvement
 - Lead Agency: RTMA
 - Partners: Bloomberg Philanthropi

- □ Safety Direction 2: Focusing on the main roads, where trauma is most concentrated
 - 12 Action Items
 - Institutionalize road safety audits
 - Road safety inspection of 400 kilometers of main roads by iRAP protocol; improve 298km
 - Identify and treat high-risk locations
 - Safe Intersection Program
 - Improve road marking and signage
 - Attain speed limit compliance on selected high-speed roads
 - Lead: AACRA/RTMA
 - Partners:











- Safety Direction 3: Prioritizing pedestrians first, second and third
 - 5 Action Items
 - Perform pedestrian facility inspections every six months; maintain facilities according to the required standard
 - Increase and maintain nighttime pedestrian visibility
 - Develop and implement Car Free Day program
 - Develop and implement School Road Safety Program
 - Identify and construct appropriate pedestrian crossings on ring road and LRT corridors
 - Lead: AACRA/RTMA











- □ Safety Direction 4: Enforcing key safety laws supported by awareness creation
 - Communication and Education
 - 9 Action Items
 - Build the capacity of political leaders and professionals working on road safety
 - Promote safe behavior of road users
 - Design hard-hitting media and social media campaigns on four key risk factors, coordinated with enforcement.
 - Design road safety education curricula for all levels of education
 - Empower the city's road safety media forum through continuous training
 - Lead: RTMA
 - Partners: Vital Strategies

- □ Safety Direction 4: Enforcing key safety laws supported by awareness creation
 - Enforcement
 - 7 Action Items
 - Enforce safety laws on drinking and driving
 - Enforce safety laws on speeding
 - Enforce safety laws on seat belts and child restraints
 - Enforce safety laws on helmet use
 - Enforce safety laws on driver distraction
 - Prevent illegal commercial roadside activities
 - Lead: Police
 - Partners: Partners:

- Safety Direction 5: Improving Crash and Injury Data Management
 - 5 Action Items
 - Improve police crash data recording and reporting system
 - Improve road injury and fatality reporting systems in the health sector
 - Establish a coordination body with responsibility for identifying and coordinating the road safety survey and surveillance data collection, storage and dissemination in one specific agency
 - Monitor and evaluate computerized data records for trauma hospitals and police
 - Develop, maintain and integrate key agencies' database systems containing road crash information
 - Lead: RTMA
 - Partners: Wital Strategies Vital Strategies



- □ Safety Direction 6: Improving Post-crash trauma response
 - 4 Action Items
 - Train communities and police officers in first aid
 - Procure fully equipped ambulances for emergencies and establish a central dispatch system
 - Capacity building for trauma care hospitals
 - Strengthen rehabilitation centers in Addis Ababa hospitals
 - Lead: Health Bureau
 - Partners:
